EFFECTIVE LEARNING IN RELIGION Lesson will be planned with the six macro concepts in mind by incorporating key Tier 2 and Tier 3 religious vocabulary.

Learners complete Pop Quizzes and Early Morning Learning regularly to ensure their key knowledge is recalled and embedded in the long term memory.

Artefacts, unique to individual religions, are used to enhance learning experience, as well as purposeful conversations with visitors.

By the end of Key Stage 2, our pupils will have a deep understanding of our macro concepts: faith, worship, rituals, connections, symbolism and community.
